ATOM BOMB OR CHARITY ?

This text was first published in 1949; it was translated into fifteen languages and millions of copies were printed. It was a proclamation for the campaign "Love one another or perish"¹ led by Raoul Follereau - together with his "Fight against Leprosy" - in favour of more justice, peace and love in a world blinded by power, money and the arms race.

In the years 1944, 1954, 1955, 1959 and 1962, Raoul Follereau appealed to world leaders "Lords of war and peace". He attempted to make heads of states face their responsibilities and to make each of us face our own.

From 1964 to 1969, his campaign to the UN "One Day of War for Peace"² was supported by three million young people from 125 countries. He required each UN member to devote the equivalent of one day of its military budget to the fight against illness, poverty and hunger every year.

In the international year of peace, 37 years after it was published, "Atom bomb or charity ?" is still relevant.

... At least, now, it's simple...

There is no place for equivocators, temporizers, those who make a base compromise with life.

Today we must choose,
immediately, irrevocably.

Men must learn to love one another,
to understand one another;
man must learn to live for man,
or all men will be destroyed,
all men, and all together.

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True there has always been warfare and strife.

It began with Cain and Abel.

But Cain only killed Abel.

There has been progress since then,
and progress has become an immense machine for murder.

Tomorrow one man, one alone,
one man's madness could annihilate humanity itself.

For who can guarantee that a thousand, two thousand, ten thousand
atom bombs,
dropped on the world
won't mean the end of the world ?¹

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But all this was inherent in the Creation,
in the earthly Paradise.

God willed it, with all else.

God allowed man to discover how to split the atom, and left him
free to use his knowledge as he would.

make it pause.

One atom destroys another, and the next and the next.
It's a chain of destruction,
unlimited,
and perhaps limitless.

The man who drops the bomb knows nothing of the number of
corpses sprawled across the earth.

Therefore, have charity.

One good act, one true gesture of friendship creates a feeling
of joy.

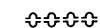
From one feeling of joy another one springs.
A chain of happiness,

It's an act of love,

the gift of oneself that ennobles and repays the effort and renunciation with joyfulness.

Charity, source of all joy.

Charity, that knows neither class,
nor caste,
nor race.

Charity, that breaks down frontiers;

Charity, that rejects all warfare;

Charity, stronger than death.

Charity, God's law,

and reflection of his eternity.



I once dreamed...

A man came to the Seat of Judgment.

"Look, God" he said, "I have kept your Law, done nothing dishonourable, wicked or impious. Lord, my hands are clean."

"Doubtless, doubtless," replied God, "but they are also empty."

millions of human beings,

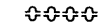
our brothers in Christ,

Chain of love or chain of death,

we must choose,

immediately,

irrevocably.
